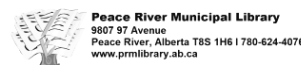


Otherhood

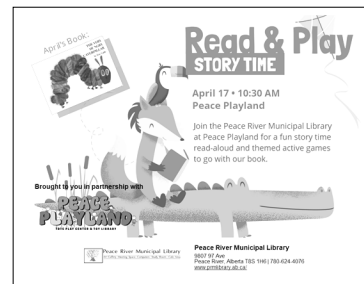
April 20 - "The Night Parade" by Kathryn Torquary
