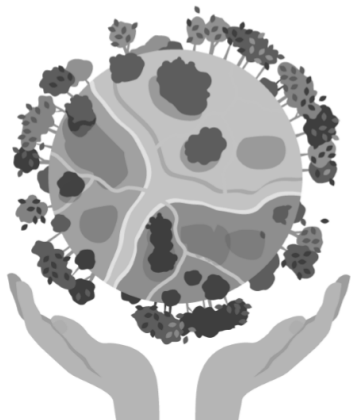


SPECIAL EVENTS

Replacement card	\$6
Institutional	\$50

Overdue and other fines:

- DVDs/CDs—50¢/day
- All other material—35¢/day
- A/V material returned in book drop—\$2
- Lost and damaged items—replacement cost

- ⇒ Card fees may be waived at the discretion of the Library Director or designate; proof of financial hardship may be required.
