www.TRACpac.ab.ca—TRACpac is an online catalogue system that lets you search the collections of many libraries across Alberta.

It also lets you manage your account so once you find the item you are looking for, you can request it right from home.

It also lets you check what you have out and when your items are due back. You can renew your items right from your computer, tablet, or phone.

TRACpac also gives you access to Libby (formerly Overdrive) for digital audiobooks and e-books and Hoopla for digital audiobooks, music, movies, TV and more.

Sign on to TRACpac with your library card number and password (phone your library if you don't know it) and start exploring.


Computers & Internet
