

#### The Heat is On





#### Naloxone Can Save a Life; Staff Trained

All library staff have been trained to use the lifesaving drug Naloxone.

Naloxone (brand name Narcan) is a drug that can reverse the effects of an opioid overdose.

Naloxone kits are provided free of charge by the province as part of the response to the opioid epidemic facing Alberta. In the event an emergency in which a person is found unconscious, Naloxone can be administered as an injection, or in some cases, as a nasal spray

Library staff are now practiced in administering the naloxone injection, and two naloxone kits are onsite. Training was provided for free, courtesy of Northreach Society in Grande Prairie. Free naloxone kits are available at local pharmacies and pharmacists can provide the naloxone training onsite.

Accidental opioid poisoning results in many deaths each year. In the North Zone, 16 people died in March 2022 alone.

## Library Expands Collection With Literacy Kits

#### **June 2022**

Everything old can be made anew, and that is what we are doing with our literacy kits at the library. In 2017, Peace Parent Link (now Family Resource Network) donated four literacy kits to the library. These kits were kept as part of our programming collection but have now been added to our public collection. Themes for these kits include Music, Dinosaurs, Feelings, and Farms.

These kits are aimed at young children, ages 0-6. Each theme works on early literacy skills, such as recognizing patterns & shapes, learning to identify feelings, and practicing fine motor

skills. Story telling aspects are woven throughout. Kits contain an assortment of books, activities, puzzles, puppets, and CDs. These kits are now available for checkout and are located alongside the Pick-a-Pack books for kids.

These literacy kits are not the first non-traditional loan items in the library. Last fall the library added loanable board games to the collection for at-home use. The board game pilot was immensely popular, and the library has since grown the collection. Other non-traditional loans include cake pans, and for in-house use, headphones & webcams.




