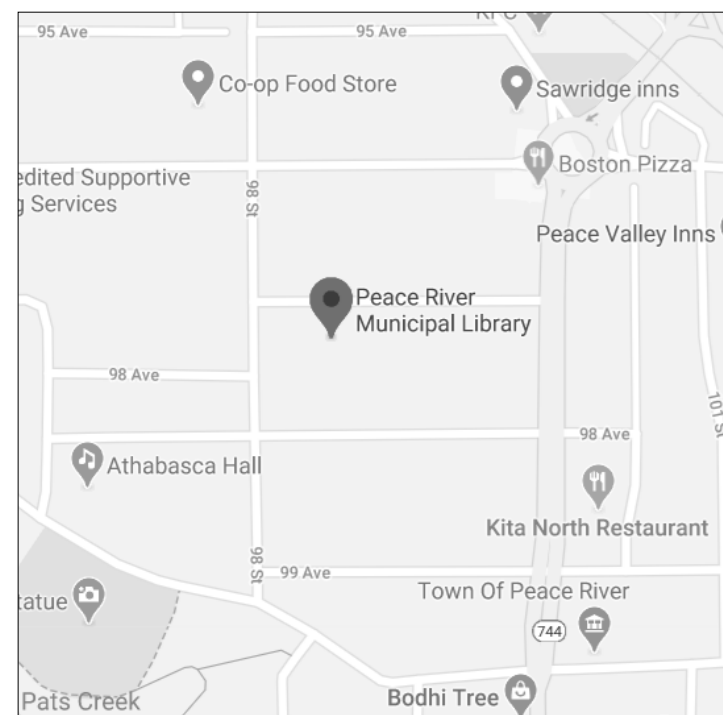
Library cards must be renewed annually.

Kids' Board Game Afterschool Club:

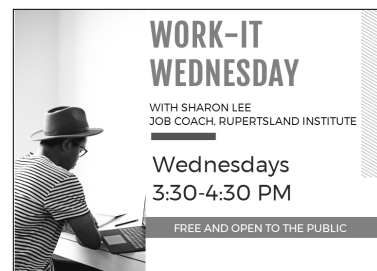
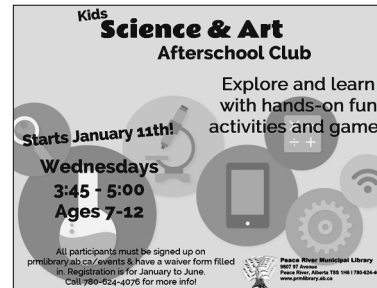

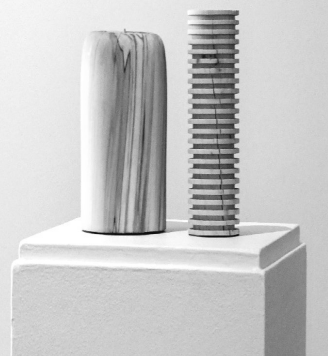
In the Art Gallery—March 2nd to April 12th.—TREX : *The Nameless Boy who gave his name to Sunday*

Join us March 29 at 6:45 for some book chat about our February books and to pick up your choice of two new book choices - one for fiction lovers and one for non-fiction fans.

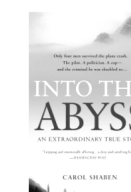

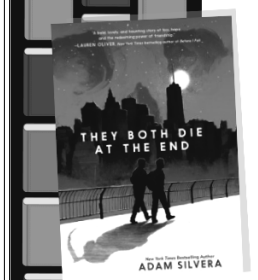

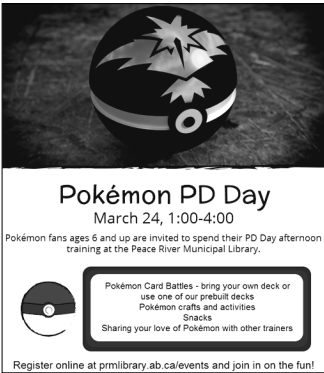
ASIST Training:

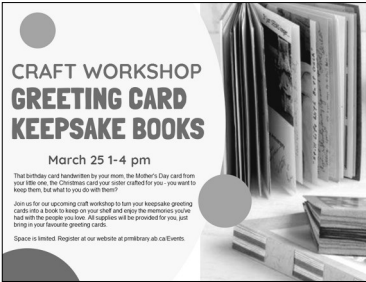
Pokémon PD Day:

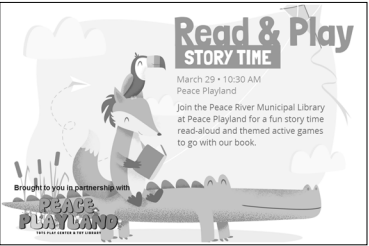

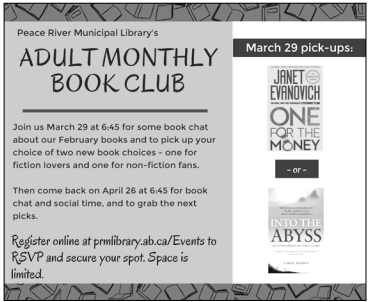

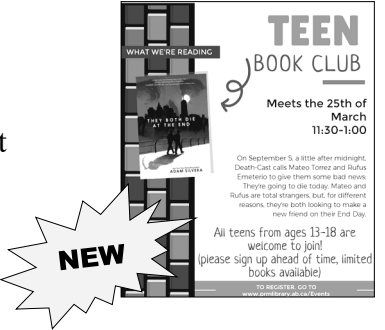
Monthly Book Club:
