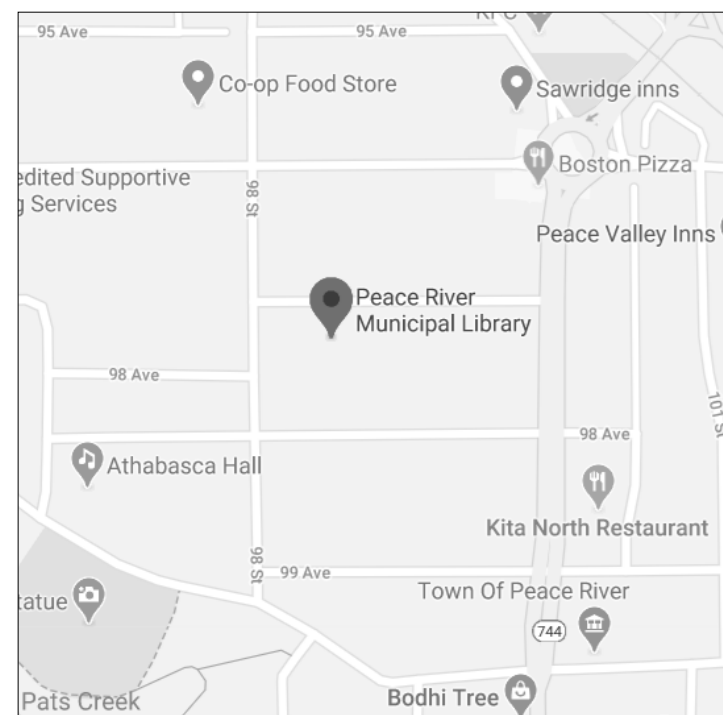
Library cards must be renewed annually.

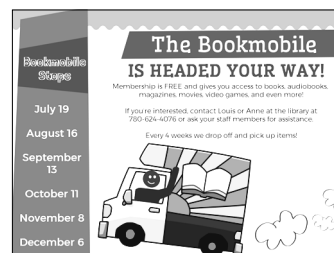
## Dungeons and Dragons:

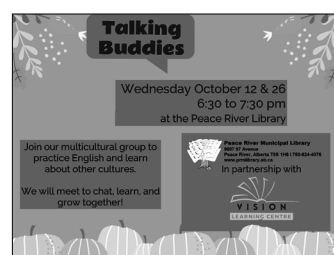
## Bookmobile:

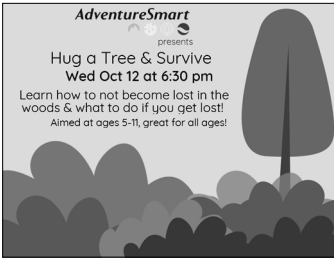
**Journal Friends:**

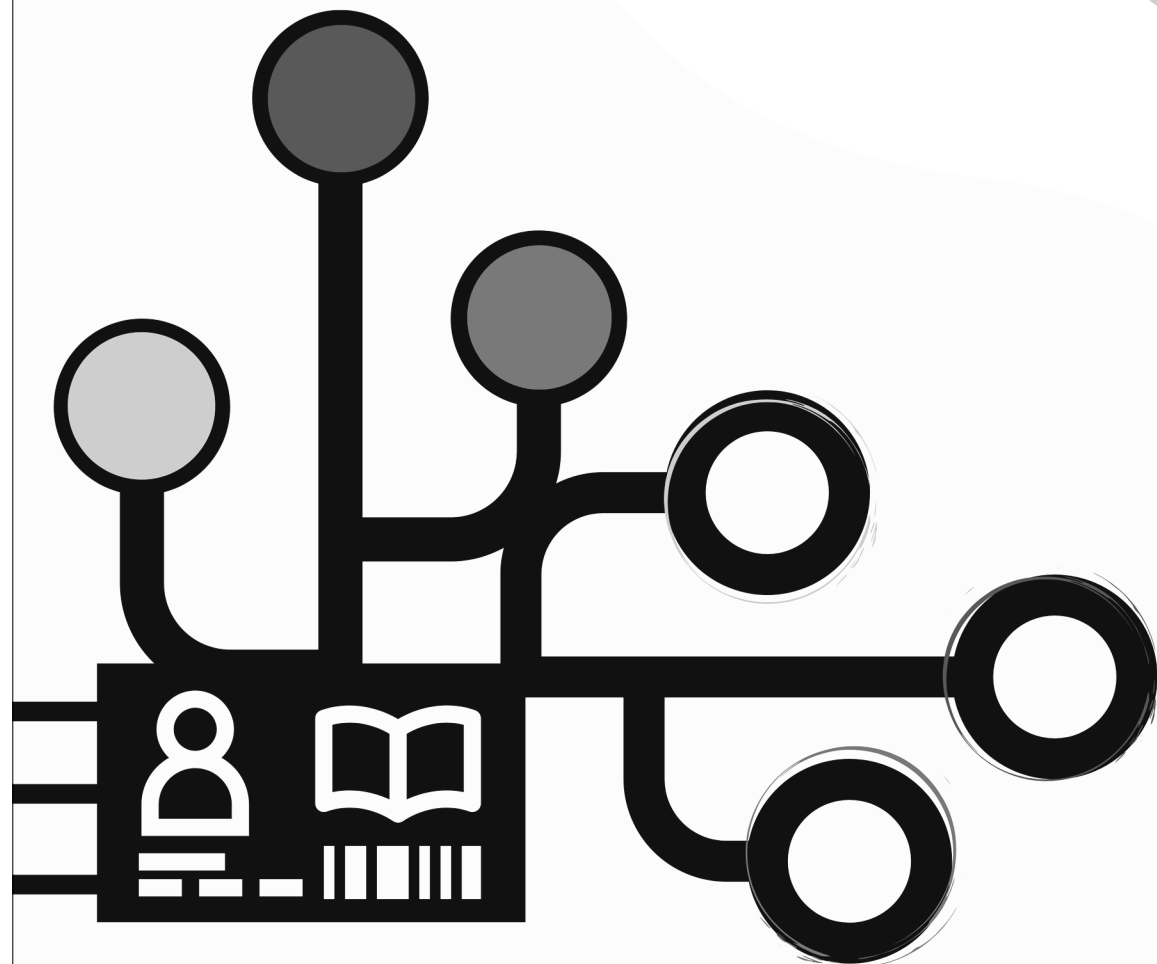

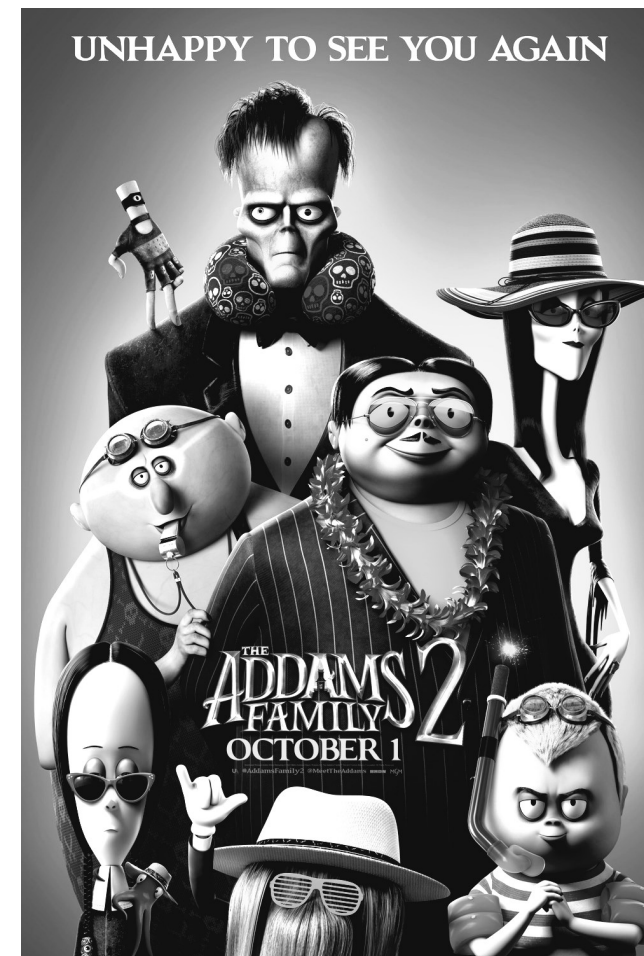

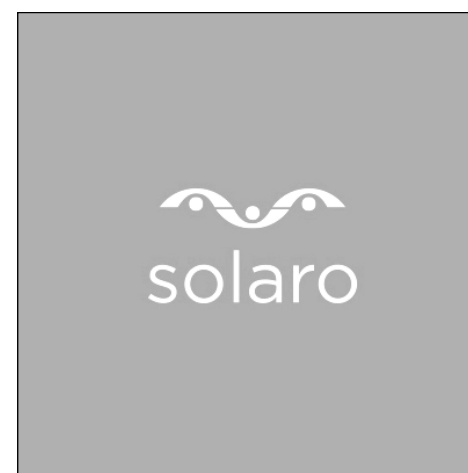
